# **English 102:** Arthurian Fiction

#### When and Where this course meets:

#### **Course Description**

English 102 is a course normally taken by Wofford students in the spring of their freshman year. The course combines an in-depth study of some topic in fiction with college-level composition, including knowledge of research and documentation. The topic for this section is Arthurian fiction.

#### **Course Objectives**:

Students should achieve an understanding of the elements of fiction, an appreciation of the literary value of the texts covered, and the ability to write and speak about them with clarity, insight and eloquence. In addition, students will know how to plan and write a research paper.
